he Old Dominion Packard Club was founded in 1958 to preserve and enjoy Packard automobiles, as well as the interesting and diverse history of the Packard Motor Car Company. The idea sprang from the mind of Herb Hulvey. Postcards were sent to all known Virginia Packard owners proposing the establishment of a club devoted to the Packard marque, since it was clear that Packards would no longer be built.



The Old Dominion Packard Club is independent and not affiliated with any other organization. The Club holds two functions each year — a Spring Tour held during the fourth weekend of April and a Fall Tour during the fourth weekend of October. Cars are judged every other year during the Fall Tour. Dues for the Old Dominion Packard Club are \$30 annually.

Donroy Ober


Donroy Ober of Mechanicsville, VA, died to Oct. 1, six days' shy of his 89th birthday.


Marjorie Joslin

2023 End-of-the-Year ODPC Financial Report

The following is a summary of the financial state of the Old Dominion Packard Club:

Checking Account Balance as of 10/17: \$7.710.93

Business Savings Account Balance as of 10/17: \$1,364.75

Total Deposits: \$11,862.50

Total Expenditures: \$10,353.69

The Old Dominion Packard Club has grand total of **165** members — **98** spouse/partner/single combination of dues-paid members. The influx of new members equals or excedes the number of members who leave the club. There is a distinct enthusiasm for the Club overall, and as a result, Membership Chairperson Lynn Shirey continually adds new members to the roster. The ODPC implemented an October 31 deadline for dues and the Club has met that deadline. The financial state of our Club is stable and strong.

In 2022, ODPC's printing costs were about \$1,900, which included rosters, newsletters, and tour guides. ODPC paid \$452 for postage. In 2023, our rosters cost almost \$300, up about \$30 more than the cost 2022's roster. The total cost of printing for 2023 (excluding the cost of this Winter Newsletter) was \$1,361. Based on the cost of the Summer Newsletter, I would estimate the cost of printing this newsletter will be about \$532. Postage costs for the year comes to about \$477.

Other major expenses for 2023 included Auto-Owners Insurance, \$287; Virginia Crossings Hotel, \$4.344; and Doteasy, \$538 (for hosting the ODPC webpage).

Although the Old Dominion Packard Club generallAs treasurer, I do not believe that we will need an increase in our dues for the forseeable future. Our major expenses are deposits for upcoming tours and the printing of our newsletters and rosters. The costs of these expenses continue to increase due to inflation and we must anticipate and accommodate these costs.

Exciting opportunities for ODPC are onn the horizon. Vice President Steve Shirey and Secretary Mark Fingerholz are looking into programs that will allow ODPC members to pay their dues and tour registration through Venmo or PayPal, as well as to pay for names badges and bumper badges.

On behalf of the ODPC Officers and Regional Representatives, I want to thank all of you for participating in the Old Dominion Packard Club and wish you all a very happy holiday season.


Craig Coulombe receives Jefferson Diffee Distinguished Member Award
